# Present a Sunday School Lesson at Home

#### How to prepare and present the lesson

We continue to share some tips on how to go about preparing and presenting the lesson:

Step	Action	
4.	Create a pleasant (disturbance free) learning environment where you and the children are at the same level	
	Example: Sit on the mat or at a table	
5.	Read through the lesson. Re-read the lesson so that you understand it. Watch the video clip of the lesson to get a better understanding of the lesson.	
6.	Make notes for yourself on important points that you would like to remember.	
7.	Understand the objective of the lesson that your child must remember.	
8.	Present the lesson to your child by telling the story. You can even read the story if you like.	
9.	Show your child the video and recap on the meaning/purpose of the lesson.	
10.	Refer your child to the activity in the child's workbook.	
11.	Pray, or ask your child to pray and close the lesson.

#### The Lesson

Lesson Title	The Our Father (2)
Text	Matthew 6: 9-13

**Lesson Objective** 

The children are shown the significance of the Lord's Prayer so that they can pray it earnestly.

# **Lesson Summary:**

- Remember, Jesus spoke to the people of Galilee urging them to live a life pleasing to God and taught them a very important prayer: The Our Father.
- Let your child say the Lord's Prayer by heart.
- Today, we will the meaning of the rest of The Our Father.
- 'Give us this day our daily bread': We must eat and drink. Here, we ask God to
  provided us with bread, food for the body, to give us important nutrients to live
  and we ask God to provide us with spiritual bread, food for our soul, which is the
  word of God.
- 'And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors': Our sins can only be forgiven if we are also prepared to forgive those whom have hurt us. But, it is very important that the matter is truly forgiven. If we have not truly forgiven, our sins not be forgiven, even if we take part in the Holy Communion.
- 'And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one': Everyone has short comings, bad habits or bad thoughts. We may be unfriendly, lazy, dishonest, or may hurt or harm others. In The Our Father we ask the Lord to free us from such evils. We ask God to give us the strength to overcome bad habits and to resist temptation. God has the power to help us make the right choices.
- 'For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever.": God is our spiritual light. His kingdom will be glorious and peaceful. We wait for this joyfully. This kingdom is our future. God gives us strength to reach our goal and gain eternal life. We praise and glorify God and acknowledge Him to be the Almighty. We place our trust and hope in Him.
- Finally, the word 'Amen' means: So be it, so shall it be.



# What does this lesson mean for us today?

- The Lord's Prayer, The Our Father, should be prayed earnestly. It is an expression of heartfelt fellowship.
- Honour is brought to the Most High in the praise of God.
- It is the only prayer that the congregation prays together in the divine service in accordance with fixed wording. It is prayed in connection with the forgiveness of sins and the celebration of Holy Communion.
- The word 'Amen' means 'So be it!' and once more reinforces every plea and statement that has been brought to God in prayer.

# Some questions that we can ask:

1. Recite the Lord's Prayer by heart?

**Answer:** Let the child recite the prayer.

2. Explain the meaning of 'Give us this day our daily bread'?

Answer: We call on the Lord to give us bread for our body and spiritual food, being,

His word.

3. Why should we forgive those who did wrong to us (our debtors)?

**Answer:** So that we too can be forgiven by God.
