How to prepare and present the lesson

We continue to share some tips on how to go about preparing and presenting the lesson:

Step	Action	
4.	Create a pleasant (disturbance free) learning environment where you and the children are at the same level	
	Example: Sit on the mat or at a table	
5.	Read through the lesson. Re-read the lesson so that you understand it. Watch the video clip of the lesson to get a better understanding of the lesson.	
6.	Make notes for yourself on important points that you would like to remember.	
7.	Understand the objective of the lesson that your child must remember.	
8.	Present the lesson to your child by telling the story. You can even read the story if you like.	
9.	Show your child the video and recap on the meaning/purpose of the lesson.	
10.	Refer your child to the activity in the child's workbook.	
11.	Pray, or ask your child to pray and close the lesson.

The Lesson

Lesson Title	Joseph is sold
Text	Genesis 37: 12-36

Lesson Objective

The children learn that hate and envy can have terrible consequences if we act on it. They learn that the Lord allows things beyond our understanding to happen, but He is always close to those who trust in Him.

Lesson Summary:

The lesson centres on how we do not always understand what happens in our lives, but that we can always trust in God.

- Jacob sent Joseph to see if his brothers are well where they were tending the flocks in Shechem.
- Joseph is excited to see his brothers, however, when his brothers saw him from a
 distance, their jealousy and hate flared up anew and blinded by anger they plot
 and decide to kill Joseph.
- Reuben, the eldest brother, however stops them. "Don't shed any blood. Throw him alive into an empty well". The brothers agreed. Reuben secretly thought that he would later rescue Joseph, while the others were sleeping.
- When Joseph reaches his brothers, they tear off his new coat and throw him into a dried-up well.
- While they were eating, they saw a group of Ishmaelites travelling to Egypt. Judah, then said to his brothers: "Let's not kill Joseph, let's sell him to these Ishmaelites."
 So they pulled Joseph out of the well and sold him for twenty pieces of silver.
- Reuben was not with his brothers when this happened, so when he didn't see
 Joseph he tore his clothes in grief because he couldn't save him.
- Then, they took Joseph's coat, killed a goat and dipped the coat into the blood. They then took the coat to Jacob and tells him that Joseph was killed by a wild animal. Jacob was heartbroken and mourned for his son for a long time.
- Meanwhile, in Egypt, Joseph was sold as a slave.



What does this lesson mean for us today?

- Due to their hatred, jealousy and envy Joseph's brothers wanted to kill him, but God protected Joseph and instead they sold him to the Ishmaelites.
- The Lord cannot always spare His children from misfortune, but He comforts and protects us in time of need.
- Things went badly for Joseph, but the Lord was always close to Him, even if Joseph did not always feel this to be so. The Lord wanted to protect and bless him.
- God is always with those who trust in Him. Even when we cannot understand why bad things happen to us, we know that we can always trust in God for His comfort, strength and protection, because He loves us.

Remember, God wants to protect us and bless us. Even when we do not understand His ways we can trust in God.

Some questions that we can ask:

1. Ask the children how they would have reacted to being thrown into a dried-up well by their siblings.

A: Let the child answer

- 2. Speak to the children about how jealousy and hatred can blind us and make us do horrible things because we are angry. Some people even land in prison. We must learn to, no matter what others do unto us or what others have, always love one another. God loves us all and has plans to protect us and bless us.
- 3. Ask the children how God protected Joseph?

A: We guide the children to understand that all these things happened to Joseph but he was protected by God. God stopped his brothers from killing him. And later we will see why all these things had to happen.

A Prayer for Daddy and Mommy to pray before the lesson:

Dear God, thank you for another day, Bless us all.

May we feel your presence, Bless the lesson we will have.

Thank you for always protecting us.

We ask that you forgive us, Lord, for our jealous hearts.

Fill us with Your Spirit that we may rejoice in the success of others.

Send Jesus to fetch us, And may we be ready to meet Him
