How to prepare and present the lesson

Below are some tips on how to go about preparing and presenting the lesson:

Step	Action

	Note:
	2.1: An ideal time preferably to present the lesson is after the Sunday morning service in line with the normal Sunday School time to maintain the routine.
	 2.2. Please keep the lesson as concise as possible, bearing in mind the retention span (to focus on the lesson) of our children – you know your child best. Sunday School normally does not exceed 45 minutes.
	2.3: The lessons are class specific (i.e. SS, RI or Confirmation).
	2.4: Please contact your SS teacher if you need any of the above resources.
3.	Pray (see the prayer at the end of this document) and ask God to use you as a tool to present the lesson the way He would want us to present it.

How to prepare and present the lesson

We continue to share some tips on how to go about preparing and presenting the lesson:

Step	Action
4.	Create a pleasant (disturbance free) learning environment where you and the children are at the same level
	<i>Example:</i> Sit on the mat or at a table
5.	Read through the lesson. Re-read the lesson so that you understand it. Watch the video clip of the lesson to get a better understanding of the lesson.
6.	Make notes for yourself on important points that you would like to remember.
7.	Understand the objective of the lesson that your child must remember.
8.	Present the lesson to your child by telling the story. You can even read the story if you like.
9.	Show your child the video and recap on the meaning/purpose of the lesson.
10.	Refer your child to the activity in the child's workbook.
11.	Pray, or ask your child to pray and close the lesson.

Joseph the rescuer

Genesis 41: 53-57 and Genesis 42

The children are shown that the Lord fulfils His promises.

Lesson Summary:

- Pharaoh, the king of Egypt, had two strange dreams. In the first dream, he saw seven fat cows coming out of the river and grazing on the river's bank, then seven thin ugly cows came out of the river and ate the seven fat cows, but they stayed thin and ugly. In the second dream, he saw seven ears of corn growing from one stalk, they were full and ripe. Then seven thin ears grew and ate the full ears, but they stayed thin.
- No one in Egypt could interpret these dreams, but then Pharaoh's chief butler remembers Joseph in prison and tells Pharaoh about him.
- When Joseph heard his dreams, God revealed the meaning to him. Joseph says to Pharaoh: "Both dreams have the same meaning. The seven fat cows and full ears of corn indicate seven years of good harvest in your country and the seven thin cows and thin ears of corn indicate seven years of drought and famine. This will happen in the near future."
- Because Joseph had interpreted the dreams, Egypt was able to prepare and they stored enough food to last them through the drought. Pharaoh has put Joseph in charge of this process and many people from other countries came to Egypt to buy grain and food from him.
- Jacob also sends his sons to Egypt to go and buy grain.
- When the brothers reached Egypt, they are taken to a very important and distinguished looking gentleman. They bow before him.
- Joseph recognises his brothers, but doesn't tell them who he is. He asks where they come from. When they answer, he accuses them of being spies. They tell him that they were twelve brothers, that their father is Jacob, their youngest brother Benjamin is home and one brother disappeared. Joseph again says they are spies and locks them up.
- Three days later they are brought before Joseph. He says that if they wish to remain alive they must take the grain home. One will stay behind as a hostage but they must return with their youngest brother. Simeon stays behind. Joseph must hide his tears or his brothers will see.



- On their way back the brothers discover that the bags of grain also contain the money they paid for the grain. They are very confused.
- When they tell Jacob what has happened he does not want to send Benjamin back with them.
- The brothers try their best to convince their father. We will see if they succeeded next week.

What does this lesson mean for us today?

- God fulfilled all the dreams even the dream of the brothers bowing before Joseph.
- God always fulfils His promises we must trust Him.
- Joseph completely forgave his brothers and always trusted that God is with him. He knew that God will keep His promises.
- We too, must always trust God, even in difficult times. God loves us, He is always with us and keeps His promises to us. God has great plans for us, just trust Him.

Some questions that we can ask:

- 1. What was Joseph's first dream about? Answer: The sheaves tied by his brothers, bowed before Joseph's sheaf
- 2. How was this dream fulfilled by God?Answer: Josephs brothers bowed before him when they wanted to buy grain
- 3. What did Joseph ask the brothers to do? Answer: To take the grain home and come back with their youngest brother
- 4. What did Jacob do when he heard this? Answer: He did not want Benjamin to go
