#### How to prepare and present the lesson

| 4.   | Create a pleasant (disturbance free) learning environment where you and the children are at the same level   |  |
|      | Example: Sit on the mat or at a table  |  |
| 5.   | Read through the lesson. Re-read the lesson so that you understand it. Watch the video clip of the lesson to get a better understanding of the lesson. |  |
| 6.   | Make notes for yourself on important points that you would like to remember.   |  |
| 7.   | Understand the objective of the lesson that your child must remember.  |  |
| 8.   | Present the lesson to your child by telling the story. You can even read the story if you like.  |  |
| 9.   | Show your child the video and recap on the meaning/purpose of the lesson.  |  |
| 10.  | Refer your child to the activity in the child's workbook.  |  |
| 11.  | Pray, or ask your child to pray and close the lesson.  |  |

#### The Lesson

| Lesson Title | Holy Communion      |

| Text         | Matthew 26: 26 - 28 |

Lesson Objective

The children are happy to receive Holy Communion. They recognise the meaning and significance of this celebration.

## **Lesson Summary:**

The lesson centres around the sacrament of Holy Communion.

- Shortly before His death, Jesus instituted Holy Communion at the Last Supper with His Apostles in remembrance of His suffering and death.
- We celebrate Holy Communion in the divine services.
- It enables us to have close fellowship with the Lord Jesus just like the Apostles at the Last Supper and secures eternal life for our souls.
- The body and blood of Jesus contains the power enabling us to overcome anything which might hinder our salvation.
- Today, the sermon prepares us for the celebration of Holy Communion.
- We pray the Our Father. Thereafter, our sins are forgiven, this is done through a prayer by the Minister from the altar – prayer of absolution.
- The Holy Communion (wafer) is then consecrated. In doing so, the Minister speaks
  the same words in his prayer as the Lord Jesus did at the Last Supper. Read
  Matthew 26: 26-28
- Through this consecration, the wafer carries the life and power of the Son of God.
- When dispensing Holy Communion, the Minister says: "The body and blood of Jesus given for you" and we respond saying "Amen".
- By celebrating Holy Communion, we are as close to Jesus as His Apostles were at the Last Supper.
- We receive the strength to improve ourselves and to overcome sin. Jesus gives us the strength to leave behind the bad and to do good.



- Every time we take Holy Communion we should do so joyfully and gratefully in remembrance of Jesus Christ's sacrifice.
- The wafer we use for Holy Communion, is unleavened bread (bread without yeast) and on it are three drops of wine and the first (alpha) and last letters omega) of the Greek alphabet. They mean that Jesus Christ is the beginning and the end.

#### What does this lesson mean for us today?

- Holy Communion is a sacrament.
- Jesus instituted it Himself in remembrance of His suffering and death.
- We celebrate Holy Communion. It gives us a close connection with Jesus.
- Jesus gives us power through communion to overcome all bad and to do good.
- We are joyful and thankful to celebrate this in remembrance of the sacrifice of Jesus for us all.

#### Some questions that we can ask:

- 1. What is the meaning of the three red dots and the Symbols on the wafer? **Answer:** The red dots are the wine which symbolises Christ's Blood. The A (alpha) and  $\Omega$  (Omega) are the first and last letters in the Greek alphabet. They signify that Jesus is the beginning and the end.
- 2. When do we receive the forgiveness of sins?
  Answer: Our sins are forgiven through the prayer of absolution after we pray the Our Father. Through the dispensing of the wafer we have fellowship with Christ. We receive strength to refrain from sin.

### A Prayer for Daddy and Mommy to pray before the lesson:

Dear God, thank you for another day, Bless us all.

May we feel your presence, Bless the lesson we will have

We ask that you lead us onward into the long journey to which you have called us.

We believe that sealing is one of the most important moments. It is how we become a Child of God.

Help us to understand this act of dedication with clear minds and full hearts.

Send Jesus to fetch us, And may we be ready to meet Him

In Jesus name we pray this - Amen
