words and deeds of Jesus Christ have remained alive. He has been preaching the gospel for many years, he cares for the apostolic congregations and openly professes himself to Christ. This is not well received everywhere. He has to bear much suffering and injustice. The authorities and rulers have him arrested. They ban him to the small Greek island of Patmos. And here, in the solitude, God and Jesus Christ are particularly close to him. Apostle John busies himself with that which the Lord Jesus has said and looks forward to his Lord's return. In numerous visions, John sees all the things which will happen in the future.

At one stage Jesus Christ appears to him in a brilliant light and in royal splendour—his face is as bright as the sun, and he is wearing a robe reaching to his feet, with a broad golden band around the chest. He is holding seven stars and seven golden candlesticks in his hand. He places his right hand on John's shoulder and says: "Do not be afraid! I am the first and the last. I am the Living One! I was dead, but now I am alive for ever and ever. I have authority over death and the world of the dead. Write, then, the things you see: Both the

things that are now, and the things that will happen afterwards."

John writes down everything which Jesus Christ shows him. It will be a very special book indeed! Its title 'Revelation' reveals that it is about what will happen in future. This book is not an easy one to read, as most of the visions which Apostle John saw are difficult for us to grasp and understand. But one thing comes through very clearly: in the course of time much suffering will take place. It often appears as if God's enemies can simply do as they please. But finally Christ shall rule and reign as King over everything and everyone!

Apostle John also writes of the wonderful joy which awaits the faithful children of God. He sees the heavenly bride in God's glory!

- We bring a photograph of a wedding and look at it with the children. A wedding is something very special. Two people who love one another want to be together for ever. They have long been looking forward to this day.
  - For such a feast many preparations must be made. The customs traditional to the country concerned may be discussed with the children.
- The Lord Jesus has promised to return and fetch his own. After the wedding in heaven his bride will remain with him for ever. We discuss the wedding feast of the Lamb (Jesus Christ) with the children and compare it to the photograph.
  - Bridegroom: The bridegroom of the soul is Jesus Christ. He is king and ruler over everything. We want to love and honour him. We await him and prepare ourselves for his return.
  - Bride: All faithful children of God on earth and in the beyond constitute the bride. They love the Lord Jesus and follow him faithfully. They prepare themselves for the day of the wedding.
  - Garment: The beautiful wedding garment is given to the bride by the Lord Jesus. It should be pure and lovely. This garment, soiled through the sins and failings of our earthly life, is cleansed through the forgiveness of sins.
- How do we prepare ourselves for this wonderful day? (Faithful following and partaking of the sacraments are essential prerequisites. We believe that the Lord Jesus will come soon and pray that he will grant us the grace to be taken when he comes. We overcome those things which the Lord dislikes. But without God's grace no one can attain this goal.)
