Elaborate on answers through further questions A student reads aloud	We believe in the triune God, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. We believe that God has become Man in Jesus Christ for our salvation.

"I do not pray that You should take them out of the world, but that You should keep them from the evil one." Elaborate on answers through further questions	Jesus Christ wants all of God's children to be in eternal fellowship with God and Him in glory. This is also our objective and our greatest wish!
Explain	With these two prayers which we have discussed the Lord Jesus has shown us what is significant to Him. When we pray in this spirit we are praying in accordance with God's will. He will then hear us (cf. 1 John 5: 14). In the next lesson we will consider our personal prayers from this viewpoint.
