How to prepare and present the lesson

Below are some tips on how to go about preparing and presenting the lesson:

	Note:
	2.1: An ideal time preferably to present the lesson is after the Sunday morning service in line with the normal Sunday School time to maintain the routine.
	 2.2. Please keep the lesson as concise as possible, bearing in mind the retention span (to focus on the lesson) of our children you know your child best. Sunday School normally does not exceed 45 minutes.
	2.3: The lessons are class specific (i.e. SS, RI, or Confirmation).
	2.4: Please contact your SS teacher if you need any of the above resources.
3.	Pray (see the prayer at the end of this document) and ask God to use you as a tool to present the lesson the way He would want us to present it.

How to prepare and present the lesson

We continue to share some tips on how to go about preparing and presenting the lesson:

Step	Action		
4.	Create a pleasant (disturbance free) learning environment where you and the children are at the same level		
	Example: Sit on the mat or at a table		
5.	Read through the lesson. Re-read the lesson so that you understand it. Watch the video clip of the lesson to get a better understanding of the lesson.		
6.	Make notes for yourself on important points that you would like to remember.		
7.	Understand the objective of the lesson that your child must remember.		
8.	Present the lesson to your child by telling the story. You can even read the story if you like.		
9.	Show your child the video and recap on the meaning/purpose of the lesson.		
10.	Refer your child to the activity in the child's workbook.		
11.	Pray, or ask your child to pray and close the lesson.

The Lesson

Lesson Summary:

- Elisha was Elijah's successor and a respected prophet in Israel.
- God performed many miracles through Elisha.
- A miracle is when something happens which man cannot explain.

Miracle 1: Naaman is healed: Read 2 Kings 5: 1-8

- Naaman, the Syrian captain, had leprosy. His wife's maid told him that prophet Elisha would be able to heal him. Naaman went to Israel.
- Naaman washed himself seven times in the river Jordan as instructed by Elisha and a miracle happened, he was cured!
- He returned to Elisha, praising God and vowed to pray to the living God.

Miracle 2: The floating iron: Read 2 Kings 6: 1-7

- Elisha's disciples wanted to build a bigger house for themselves.
- While they were busy cutting the trees, one the of men's axe flew off into the river.
- Elisha cut a stick and threw it into the water where the axe went under.
- Another miracle happened! The axe, which was made of iron, floated to the surface and the man was happy to be able to take it out of the water.

Miracle 3: The Syrians are struck with blindness: Read 2 Kings 6: 8-20

- The King of Syria waged war against Israel and the army commanders were told to lie in wait at a certain place to outwit the Israelites.
- God revealed to Elisha the intentions of the Syrian King so Elisha sent a messenger to the King of Israel to warn him.
- This made the Syrian King very angry and he decided to take Elisha prisoner.
- Elisha's servant was afraid when he saw the Syrian army surrounding the city. Elisha prayed, "Lord, open his eyes."



- God opened the servant's eyes and he saw God's might.
- Elisha prayed again, and God struck the Syrians with blindness.
- They did not recognize Elisha when he led them to Samaria and the King of Israel.
- Elisha then prayed again and God opened the Syrians eyes.
- On Elisha's advice the King of Israel gave them food and let them go to their King.
- The Syrian King no longer let his warriors force their way into the land of Israel.

What does this lesson teach us?

- We should seek God's help in our times of worry and need.
- How can we seek God's help?
 - Ø We can pray directly to Him.
 - Ø We can ask our ministers for help.
 - Ø We can ask our parents for advice.
- We can go our way without fear as we are not alone. Prayers are said for us.
- God knows the right time to provide His help.
- We should humbly ask for God's help and patiently wait for it.
- The greatest miracle is yet to come, when Jesus returns to come and fetch us to be with Him in heaven.

- 1. **GOD MAKES** people into children of God through the laying of hands of a living Apostle.
- 2. **ELIJAH** went up to heaven in a fiery chariot.
- 3. **JESUS WILL TAKE** us to himself on the day of his return.
- 4. **GOD TOOK** Enoch from this earth because of his God-fearing ways.
- 5. **ELIJAH CAUSED** an iron axe to float because God suspended the laws of nature for a moment.
- 6. **MOSES LED** the people of Israel through the Red sea.

Answer: Elisha was Elijah's successor, He was a respected prophet in Israel and His activity was accompanied by many a miracle of God
