


# OUR CONGREGATION AND DISTRICT



## Introductory Remarks

- It would be appropriate to invite the rector for this lesson.
- To begin with, some information about the congregation may perhaps have to be compiled from a chronicle.

The lesson would come alive for the children if old or current photographs (for example, of ministers, the choir, etc.) were available.

- Comment regarding exercise 2: The teacher prepares the information chart, possibly with the rector's help.
- Comments regarding exercise 3: If the rector is not present, explain to the children that the questions were given to him in advance and he provided his answers in writing. Optional: you might like to do a role-play with a child assuming the role of the rector answering the questions.
- Comment regarding the conclusion. If you plan on writing a letter to another religious instruction class in a neighbouring congregation, bring along writing paper.

### Lesson Plan

#### Lead-In

Workbook, Exercise 1

The children do the exercise and compare the answers.

### **Implementation**

**Question Prompt** 

What do you know about our congregation? What is done by whom?

Discussion

Listen to the children's answers.

Workbook, Exercise 2

Then work on the description of the congregation, and study the photographs which were brought.

Workbook, Exercise 3

The children take turns asking the rector questions. The rector reports about the congregation.

Conclusion	
	Let the children talk about which congregations in the district they know by name and have already visited. They talk about the rectors they know.

	The children have the opportunity to discuss what they think is especially good about their congregation and what they wish for.
