

**The Bible**

The Bible, also known as "Holy Scripture" is divided into two parts:

The Old Testament comprises the accounts of the creation and the development and history of the people of Israel, as well as doctrinal and prophetic books from the time before Christ's birth.

The New Testament contains the writings which have been handed down about the mission and activity of Jesus and His apostles, the apostles' letters to the congregations of the early church, as well as the Revelation of John.

The original text of the Old Testament was mainly written in Hebrew whereas the New Testament was written in Greek. There are translations of the Bible or parts thereof in well over a thousand languages. The Bible is the most widely circulated book in the world.
